After spending some time thinking and praying about the shootings at a grocery store in Buffalo, NY, a Church in Laguna Woods, CA and an elementary school in Uvalde, Texas within a week, I needed to respond.

Please note: though I discuss the problem of simply proclaiming our prayers for victims and their families without taking action on their behalf, I don't mean to discount the power of prayer. We must pray for them *as part of our action*, but must also pray for the empathy to listen in love, for humility in our discussions and opinions, and for faithful, wise solutions. Here's as close to wisdom as I've come:

"One of the things I've found most stressful as a Pastor during the pandemic is the pressure to say "the right thing" on social media. I don't feel that same pressure when I'm sitting with folks in their fear, suffering, or grief. The Holy Spirit takes the power of presence in those moments and does the work for me, not true for social media.

I avoid making "statements", not because I'm afraid of offending people, but because I don't believe it is worth saying things in a way that they won't be heard. Healing, teaching, and transformation are one-on-one work, especially in our deeply divided country, where people so quickly jump to conclusions about your opinions and scroll quickly on. I think it is why you see so many "thoughts and prayers" comments. Saying that you are thinking of someone and praying for them is true and can't be misconstrued. **But it is clearly not enough**, and people are tired of hearing it. We feel the truth in the words of Miroslav Volf, "There is something deeply hypocritical about praying for a problem you are unwilling to resolve."

The other dangerous temptation we have as Christians is to imply that it is the lack of Christian faith that leads to these moments of terror. Those folks should learn more about Christian History. They'll quickly learn that a passionate belief in Jesus doesn't correlate at all to nonviolence or justice. Ask a waitress after the Sunday afternoon rush and you'll find out it doesn't even correlate to patience or common courtesy.

I don't have the answer. There likely isn't ONE answer to the violence that we are so heartsick about and exhausted by. If there is one spiritual discipline that might be of use to the world in preventing violence, I believe it is empathy.

The suffering of others should matter to us. We must have emotional imagination enough to think about how something makes another person feel and, even better, to ask. And we must model that for our children in our conversations and behavior toward one another in the wake of yet another nightmare.

At its heart, violence is one person or group of people who have decided that what they want, either to accomplish, to gain, or to feel, is more important than the suffering and death of another person. We aren't real to each other anymore (cont'd pg 3).


